Read and Explain the Life Skills. Discuss the exercises with them. Then the children will do the Life Skills exercises in the books.

Home Work idea: Ask the children what are the things at home that you should not touch and take care of.

Write the names of the things and also write reasons why you should not touch them.

What can happen if you touch them?

Day 8

Write some safety rules for everyone to follow at home and in school. Divide the children in to groups. Give 2 or 3 groups to write about the home safety rules and the rest of the groups about the school safety rules.

Write them in bullet form. Decorate it around on the borders.

Make photocopies of them and distribute them among your school.

Chapter 14

Day 1

New Terminologies:

Flood, experts, staff, customers

Explain the new concepts through:

- i. Flood: Show the children pictures of flood hit area. What damage it causes to the areas.
- **ii. Experts:** Tell the children that you are an **expert** in teaching. The principal is an expert in managing the administrative matters. In the same way there are experts of every work who can guide people.
- **iii. Staff:** Ask the children who is there in their school. The cleaner, cashier, accountant, teachers, Principal and others. All these people are the **staff** of the school.
- iv. Customers: Display some things on the table. Ask one child to be the shop keeper. Ask some children to come and buy the things and give paper money to him. These children who are buying the things are the customers.

Home Work Idea: Ask the children what is their favorite dish.

Why do they like that dish?

Which meat they like to eat the most?

Write the benefits of their favorite meat.

Why do they like that meat?

Draw a picture of their favorite meat dish. Color it and display it on the soft boards.

Day 2

Ask the children have they ever eaten fish.

What is the good thing about eating fish?

Do they know why fish is healthy to eat?

Read the lesson with correct pronunciation.

Day 3 & 4

Reading of the chapter by the students

It can be done at class level where each child reads some part, or small group level where you divide the classes in groups of three to five students and then monitor their reading.

Home Work Idea: Ask the children what kind of fish they have seen. Where?

Tell them to write an essay about their favorite fish.

Why do they like that fish?

What is the best thing about that fish?

Draw a picture also. Color it and display it on the soft boards.

Day 5

Discuss the questions/answers with the children. Discuss the questions about experts and contacting people with them.

Home Work Idea: Ask the children did they ever have a chance to talk to any expert in any matter.

What was the matter?

Who did they consult?

What advice did he give?

Was that advice proved good for you?

Tell them to write a dialogue between them and the expert. Tell them to use speech marks for the spoken words. Write at least 3-5 dialogues of you and the expert.

Day 6

Children will do the questions/answers in their copies. Then they will do the other comprehension exercises.

Read and Explain the Life Skills. Discuss the exercises with them. Then the children will do the Life Skills exercises in the books

Home Work Idea: Collect the pictures of different kind of resources. Paste them on colored papers with the finished products that are made with them. Or make a booklet of 'My Resource Book'. Display it in the display corner.

Day 8

Write a paragraph about how you use the resources wisely.

What you do to guide your family members to use the resources properly?
